

SHH ACTIVITY OF THE YEAR APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS



The SHH holds an annual contest to honor the best chapter activities of the year. Awards are given in two categories: short-term activities and long-term activities. Winners receive \$100, \$75 or \$50 depending on their placement in the contest. Up to six total awards may be given.

ELIGIBILITY:

- 1. All applicants must be current members of AATSP and sponsors of active chapters of SHH. <u>Active</u> is defined by having registered new members with the national organization during the current school year.
- 2. Each chapter may submit more than one entry, but each must be a separate activity of the chapter and accompanied by a separate application form. Identify the category on the application form.
- 3. Activities may be short term or long term and must be carried out during the 2022-2023 school year
 - Short Term Activity: One month or less completion time
 - Long Term Activity: More than one month completion time; may be on-going
- 4. All entries become the property of SHH.
- 5. While chapters may apply for both Chapter of the Year and Activity of the Year, a chapter can only win one of the two awards.
- 6. A chapter cannot win an Activity of the Year award in consecutive years.

Prizes below will be awarded to the winning chapters through the sponsors submitting the winning chapter activities:

Long Term Activity: First place — \$100.00, Second place — \$75.00, Third place — \$50.00 **Short Term Activity:** First place — \$100.00, Second place — \$75.00, Third place — \$50.00

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES:

- 1. Complete the online application.
- 2. Upload a description in Spanish of the activity. (250-word limit)
- 3. Upload 1-2 photos of activity (optional)
- 4. Submit all materials by April 1, 2023.
